The gospel passage for this solemnity comes from Mark 14 and describes the preparation that was undertaken for Jesus to celebrate his last meal with his disciples. It is made clear that this meal is a Passover meal, which according to Jewish understanding always signified God leading the Israelites from bondage into freedom. It was a celebration of national liberation and that was the context surrounding the events Jesus was shortly to undergo following this last meal. Everything is properly prepared and all of Jesus' instructions are followed carefully.

During the course of this Passover meal Jesus deviates a bit from the traditional ritual. As he takes the bread and says the blessing he breaks the bread and gives it to his disciples, telling them to take the bread, which is his body. Then he takes a cup of wine from which they all drank and he says that this is my blood of the covenant that will be shed for many. In effect, the disciples are being invited to share in Jesus' sacrificial death. This death will ratify a new covenant in his blood. The background for understanding this is Exodus 24, which was the first reading for today's celebration. Jesus concludes by saying that he will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until he drinks it new in the kingdom of God. This points ahead to the messianic banquet and the fullness of the kingdom of God. The Eucharist is thus placed within the twofold context of the messianic banquet and the sacrificial death of Jesus. And, from that time on the church has continued doing this action in memory of Jesus.
