The relationship between women and men in marriage is addressed today in our gospel reading when the Pharisees ask Jesus about divorce. Jesus answers them with a quotation from today's Genesis reading, "God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." When the disciples bring up the topic of divorce and remarriage, Jesus' answer is clear: "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery."

In today's society, many families have instances in which divorce and, at times, remarriage have occurred. Sometimes Catholics struggle with how to relate to their family members living in such situations. It helps to recall the message noted in the reading from Hebrews. All in the human family are redeemed in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, Son of God. With Christ our brother, we are all children of God. We share our humanity and reverence one another in love. Although some in our family may live in ways that challenge us and our faith traditions, we still need to let these folks know how much we love them. And in our love, we uphold them (and ourselves) in prayer.
